

Multiple Ways to Choral Read

- <u>Echo Read</u>- teacher reads text aloud while tracking it for everyone to see. Students repeat the teacher. May be done phrase-by-phrase or line-by-line.
- Choral Read- reading aloud with a whole class or group of students. Divide the class into different groups and have them read different sections.
- <u>Choral Cloze</u>- The teacher reads aloud omitting strategic words that the student then fills in. May be done with a partner as well.
- <u>Cumulative Choral</u>- The number of students reading gradually builds as the text is read. An
 individual or small group reads the first line or section of a passage, and then another group joins
 them. By the end of the passage, the whole group is reading. This can also be done in reverse,
 starting with whole group and ending with just one person or group.
- Antiphonal Choral Divide the group into groups and assign parts of the text to each group. Give
 students an opportunity to practice how they will read before bringing them back together to
 chorally read together.
